There must be two (2) successful applicants for the program to be run at your school.*

The Workers Compensation Board (WCB) is seeking two (2) high school students per school to work as a team of Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) Leaders.

As participants, you will each receive \$500 when you successfully complete the program.

What to expect:

1. **Attending a one-day mandatory orientation and training session on Friday, October 21, 2022.** The location has not been chosen yet but your mileage will be paid. October 21, 2022 is a Professional Learning Day, so you will not miss class. If you are selected for the program, you will receive more details about Orientation Day.
2. **Working as a leadership team at your school to organize four (4) events,** to take place between November 2022 and March 2023. These events will help raise awareness among other students about OHS.
3. **Promoting OHS and your four (4) events** under the guidance of the WCB Youth Education Consultant.
4. **Documenting events and activities, and producing a year-end summary** of your OHS Leadership events.

- In Grade 11 or 12
- Good at connecting with other students and coordinating with school staff
- Interested in learning, and helping others to learn, about how to stay safe at work
